# YOUR VOTE COUNTS IN THE LOUISIANA YOUNG READERS' CHOICE PROGRAM!



The Louisiana Young Readers' Choice program was founded in 1999 with the first award given in 2000. Louisiana's young people have read nearly 1.4 million books and cast 438,000 votes in the 24 years since the program began. The purpose of the program is to foster a love of reading in the children of Louisiana by motivating them to participate in the recognition of outstanding books. The lists are well-balanced selections of high-quality fiction, nonfiction, and poetry. Now entering its 24th year, the program continues to encourage Louisiana's youth to read for pleasure.

**Ballots are available at each library branch. To be qualified to vote, each student:**

- **Must read 3 or more titles from the book list on the ballot.**
- **Must live in Louisiana.**
- **Must be in grades identified on the book list.**
- **Students with special needs may participate regardless of their grade.**
- **May vote only once and vote for only one book.**

## WANT A LIBRARY CARD?

- St. John the Baptist Parish residents can obtain a library card for free if they live, work, or go to school in the parish. Proof of residency is required, such as:
  - Driver's License (current residence address)
  - State Identification Card (current residence address)
  - Checkbook with a current mailing address
  - Mail with date cancellation showing current mailing address
  - Receipt for payment of rent or utility charges.
- Youths aged 14 or older may apply for a library card with a student ID from a St. John the Baptist Parish school or a government-issued ID.
- Youths younger than 14 must have the application signed by an adult parent or legal guardian who must show proof of residency,
- Non-Residents may purchase a card for \$5.00, which is valid for 1 year.
