

Established in 1919, Children's Book Week is an annual celebration of books that aims to inspire a joy of reading within young people. Anyone, anywhere, can celebrate Children's Book Week, and this year we invite you to join "Club No Rules. Just Read." The only membership requirement is to read something – a book, magazine, comic, newspaper, poem, or even an instruction manual – during the week of November 4–10. Read alone, with a friend, or to a group. Read outside or inside, or in the weirdest place you can think of. Read fast or slow, for five minutes or five hours. 
"Tea" Rex Party

Hunter Education Certification Class

All Ages: In Louisiana, all hunters over the age of 16 must have proof of having passed a Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries (LDW&F) Hunter Education class to hunt legally. Now you can complete the class in two days at St. John the Baptist Parish Library! Students must be at least 10 years old to receive credit for this course. Children younger than 10 are not eligible to earn credit for the class but are still welcome to participate.

The Hunter Education course will involve an 8-hour class and written exam from **9** AM to **5** PM on November **4**, followed by 2-3 hours of shooting from **4** to **7** PM on November **5** for those who pass the written portion. Both sessions will take place at the Reserve Branch. The class focuses on gun safety, emergency survival, hunter ethics, and wildlife biology. The shooting portion will involve participants shooting air rifles (pellet guns) into a specially designed Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries trailer.



autumn Penne Pasta

1 pound chorizo sausage, thinly sliced 1 onion, finely chopped 4 garlic cloves, chopped 3 cups chicken broth 1½ cups diced tomatoes ½ cup heavy cream

12 ounces pasta, penne or hearty style

½ teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon pepper

2 cups pepper jack cheese, shredded

- 1. In a large, oven-safe fry pan add the chorizo and onion and cook on medium-high heat until lightly browned. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, only about 30 seconds or 1 minute.
- 2. Stir in broth, tomatoes, cream, pasta, ½ teaspoon salt, and½ teaspoon pepper and bring to boil. Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
- 3. Cover pan and reduce heat to medium-low. Simmer, stirring frequently until pasta is tender, about 15 minutes.
- 4. Remove from heat, uncover pan and stir in ½ cup cheese. Top with remaining cheese, switch oven setting to broil and heat until cheese is melted and just starting to brown, about 3 minutes

This is the fall warm dish that you will fall in love with. You cook and serve all from one skillet. If you'd rather make this a less spicy dish, change out the chorizo with a kielbasa, and switch the pepper jack with mozzarella for a milder but still excellent taste.

Cranberry apple Pie

4 apples, Pippin or Granny Smith, peeled, eared, and thinly sliced 1 cup sugar 2 Tablespoons flour 1/4 teaspoon salt

2 cups cranberries ¼ cup raisins 1 orange, zested 2 Tablespoons butter, sliced

- 1. Lay pastry crust bottom in the pie base. Cut the lattice strips for the top.
- 2. In a large bowl, add sugar, flour, salt, cranberries, raisins, apples, and orange zest. Mix well. Place mix into the pie base. Dot the slices of butter on top of the fruit mix. Add the lattice strips on the top. Brush the crust with heavy cream before baking
- 3. Heat the oven 450 degrees. Bake pie for 20 minutes, then reduce heat to 350 degrees. Bake for 40–50 minutes longer, until crust is browned and fruit is tender.

Allisons Secret pie tip: To prevent soggy pie bottoms, moisture proof your bottom crust. Seal the crust by brushing the inside of bottom pie crust with an egg white wash, or dust with combination of 1 Tablespoon of flour and sugar. Place crust in freezer for at least 20 minutes before assembling pie.
